## THE BIBLE

Matthew 28:18-20, 23:13-15, 25-28; Luke 18:9-14; Galatians 6:1-3

- Who's your favorite fictional person on a mission? What was their mission, and why were they successful (or not)?
- In your own words, what is our mission as followers of Jesus?
- How did you first hear about Jesus? How did you respond and why do you think you responded that way?
- How do you feel about sharing your faith with others? Why do you think you feel that way?
- Talk about a time you thought you had to be perfect in order to share your faith. What did you learn
  or wish you had done differently?
- Why do you think Jesus was so angry about the Pharisees' hypocrisy? What are some ways Christians' hypocrisy could keep people from coming to know Jesus today?
- As followers of Jesus, why is being real so important to our mission?
- What's one thing you're afraid to be honest or real about?
- Read Galatians 6:1-3. How can this passage help us learn how to be more real with ourselves, with God, and with each other?
- This week, what's one way you're going to work on being more real with yourself, with God, or with others?

ACTIVITY

On note cards, have everyone write one fear they have about sharing their faith. Take turns sharing what you wrote. Then work together to **find passages of Scripture that respond to each fear with hope and truth.** Have students write those passages on the back of their cards.
