HOW TO HACK THIS SERIES FOR PRETEENS

In children's ministry, you've got a wide range of ages you need to engage every week, but preteens tend to get overlooked, so here are a few adjustments you can make to this week in order to keep your preteens more engaged.

MUSIC | Eyewitness Praise

Play the video and invite kids to sing along to the <u>lyric video</u> of today's worship song.

ACTIVITY | Photo Op

Chances are that some preteens might be too shy or even "too cool" to sing and dance in front of people. Ask these questions after the song has ended:

Wow, some of you really got into it, but also I noticed some of you weren't too keen on going all out! But let me ask you something: even if you didn't sing, were you thinking about what the song is saying? Do you think worship is just about singing and dancing, though? We all worship in different ways. Now, let's find out what God has to say about worship!

RESPONSE | "Every Move I Make"

Put your preteens in the spotlight! Give them some time to learn the choreography for "Every Move I Make" and have them perform it for the rest of the group. If you have some talented dancers in your midst, have them add in their own dance moves. Afterward, they could even teach it to everyone!

ACTIVITY | Whole Heart

Show the kids this <u>two-minute video</u> on how the heart works. Here's a sample script you can follow afterwards:

- Time for Health and Science news! Does anyone know your heart's main job?
- Your heart pumps oxygen, through your blood, all throughout your body.
- Now imagine if only half of your heart did its job. What would happen?
- Another word for "sincere" is "wholehearted." What are some ways you can worship God with your whole heart your actions, words, thoughts, and feelings?
- Write them down on your heart puzzle to remind you that when you worship God, you can be sincere.

HOW TO HACK THIS SERIES FOR KIDS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

In children's ministry, you've got a wide range of ages you need to engage every week, but kids with special needs tend to get overlooked, so here are a few adjustments you can make to this week in order to keep your kids with special needs more engaged.

MUSIC | Eyewitness Praise

Many kids with special needs love music and dancing. Keep the motions short, concise and repetitive, for retention and comprehension purposes. You could also try shortening the learned part of the song so they are not overwhelmed and frustrated by the length.

ACTIVITY | Color Word Test

Keep the instruction short and concise. Stop the video at each word, instead of letting it play through. At each stop present the kiddo with the short concise instruction such as, "Tell me the color" or "What color". You could also provide a visual of the color. For example, if the word is "Yellow" but the color of the word is green, have an extra piece of green paper to reinforce the color. Compliment them for participating!

If giving praise doesn't motivate your kids, create a token economy, where kids are able to obtain stars or a small candy for each correct answer.

POLL | Real or Fake?

Instead of having kids guess the fake news, motivate kids to participate by subtly giving them the correct answer in the beginning. You can do this by incorporating gestures (e.g., thumbs up/thumbs down) and modulating your voice.



• For example: A twelve year old dog graduates college? FAKE NEWS (high energy voice) Thumbs down (paired with gesture).

No matter how they guess, emphasize more so their participation, rather than getting the correct answer. The reinforcement of the volunteers should be high affect and motivating.

ACTIVITY | Whole Heart

Pre-cut the printable for this activity (which is a heart puzzle) with each piece already labeled with the words, "actions," "words," "thoughts," and "feelings." Have kids decorate each piece and put them together with a buddy. Whatever piece they are working on, discuss with them some ways they can use that "piece" of their heart in worship and how they interact with others.

THE BIBLE

Amos: Amos 5:18-24; (Matthew 25:1-13)

LARGE GROUP TIME

WHAT? What are we talking about today?

MUSIC | Eyewitness Praise

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Play the video and invite the kids to sing along and follow the motions to this song, "10,000 Reasons."
 - **PRETEEN HACK:** Play the <u>lyric video</u> to help with retention and make it easier for kids to sing along.
 - **★ SPECIAL NEEDS HACK:** Keep motions short and repetitive, for retention and comprehension purposes. You could also shorten the learned part of the song so that kids won't get overwhelmed and frustrated by the length.

ACTIVITY | Photo Op

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Play an upbeat worship song. Tell the kids to dance, but when the music stops, they must freeze in place. While they are "frozen," take pictures as though for a newspaper article. After you have taken pictures, resume the music. Repeat a few times. If possible, you might want to take a few real pictures and print them later with captions and post them in your space.
 - ** PRETEEN HACK: After this activity, say/ask the following: "Wow, some of you really got into it, but I noticed that not everyone did! Even if you didn't sing, were you thinking about what the song is saying? Is worship just about singing and dancing, though? We all worship in different ways. Now, let's find out what God has to say about worship!"

- Extra! Extra! Read all about it! Here we are, back again with breaking news moments in the Bible where God had news to communicate through prophets. The prophet we will meet today is going to tell us something about how we worship God.
- So, let's do some freestyle worship together! When the music is playing, dance and enjoy yourselves. When the music stops, freeze in place so we can get pictures for our breaking news.

ACTIVITY | Color Word Test

- Today, we're going to talk about how actions and words sometimes don't match.
- Let's take a look at this fun little test that shows words that don't do what they should.
- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Show <u>The Stroop Test</u>, and tell the kids to call out the color of the word and not what the word says.
 - **SPECIAL NEEDS HACK:** Pause the video at each word, instead of letting it play through. At each pause, ask them to tell you the color of the word. You could also provide a separate visual paper of the color (e.g., if the word is "yellow" but the color of the word is green, hold up a piece of green paper.).
- That was hard, wasn't it? We wanted to read the word instead of calling out the color. Sometimes, what we say and what we do don't match, just like those words.

POLL | Real or Fake?

- Has anyone ever heard of fake news? This is news that isn't real or didn't happen.
- I'm going to share with you some news stories. Some are real, and some are fake. You have to spot the difference. If you think it's real, give it a thumbs up. If you think it's fake, give it a thumbs down.
- A chihuahua that can't walk befriends a bird that can't fly. (Real)
- A twelve-year-old dog graduates college. (Fake)
- Man arrested for using his phone while riding a horse. (Real)
- Cold weather in Florida could cause iguanas to fall from trees (Real)
- Ten-month-old baby becomes first ever county sheriff (Fake)
 - **★ SPECIAL NEEDS HACK:** Create motivation for kids to participate by subtly giving them the correct answer as you read each news story. You can do this by incorporating gestures such as thumbs up/thumbs down and modulating your voice accordingly. For example: "A twelve-year-old dog graduates college? FAKE NEWS (high energy voice, paired with "thumbs down" gesture).

SO WHAT? Why does it matter to God and to us?

SCRIPTURE | Amos 5:18-24

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Recruit the same or different adult volunteers to help with the skits, or play both parts yourself! Provide a handheld microphone real or pretend for the characters to use. You can even print the scripture and roll it up like a scroll for the Amos character to read aloud.
- Today, we're going to hear about a prophet named Amos. Before he was known as a prophet, Amos was a sheep herder and a farmer. He was from a place called Judah, but preached in

a place called Israel. Just like the prophet Micah we heard about last week, Amos had some breaking news for everyone.

- **Reporter:** Hello! I am [volunteer name], bringing breaking news to you from Amos. Amos has a message to us from God. What does God want us to hear, Amos?
- **Amos:** (Reads Amos 5:8-20.)
- **Reporter:** Oh, my. I'm not entirely sure what that means. "The Day of the Lord" . . . do you mean that to be the time we get to see God?
- Amos: That's exactly right! People are expecting a pat on the back from God when that day comes, but there are just some things God is not very happy about.
- **Reporter:** Oh, no! Like what?
- **Amos:** (Reads Amos 5:21-23.)
- **Reporter:** Wait, that sounds like God is not pleased about how people worship. What is wrong with their worship?
- **Amos:** Their worship is not sincere.
- Reporter: "Sincere?"
- **Amos:** It means real and true. God is isn't happy with how people say they love God and even sing songs about God, but their actions don't show it at all.
- **Reporter:** That is terrible. How can people fix this?
- **Amos:** (Reads Amos 5:24.) The way we love God is all in how also love others. God's people should always treat everyone fairly and kindly, and live in a way that honors God.
- **Reporter:** So . . . worship is not just about singing and dancing, but about how we live our lives. The things we do should match the things we say, is that correct?
- **Amos:** You got it, reporter friend.
- **Reporter:** Well, thank you, Amos, for bringing us that breaking news from God. Until next time, this is [volunteer name].
- You see, God, through Amos, was letting the people of Israel know that they were not being sincere in their worship. God had noticed they had forgotten how to worship God with their whole heart, soul, mind, and strength. They had forgotten to take care of each other and decided not to look out for those who needed help.
- Worship then and worship now has always been about more than saying all the right words to God. It's turning around and living out those right words each and every day, in real and loving ways. That's what it means to be sincere!
- What can we learn from Amos' breaking news?

THE BIG IDEA | When I worship God, I can be sincere.

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Ask two volunteers to run across the front carrying a banner that says, "Breaking News" and play the sound effects from <u>this video</u>. Ask another volunteer to play the role of the breaking news reporter every week.
- We interrupt these activities to bring you some breaking news. This is [name of volunteer] with today's Big Idea that everyone needs to remember: When I worship God, I can be sincere!
- We now return to your regularly scheduled programming.

VIDEO | Breaking News, Episode 2

• **INSTRUCTIONS:** Play this week's <u>teaching video</u>.

QUESTION | Have You Ever . . . ?

- Have you ever pretended to like something but you really didn't? Or have you ever said
 or done something but quickly changed your behavior when a parent or another grownup
 walked by?
- You know, it's fairly easy to act nice, right? But it's a whole different thing to actually be kind and caring.
- This is what Amos was talking about earlier. When we pretend to be a certain way just so we won't get in trouble or so we can get compliments, that is not sincere.
- When I worship God, I can be sincere.

OBJECT LESSON | One Hundred Percent

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Show the kids a bottle of water. Open the water and pour in a few drops of food coloring of any color.
- When you pour food coloring into a bottle of water, it completely takes over the way the water looks. No matter which way you turn the bottle, it's the same color all the way through.
- This is what our worship to God must be like. We need to allow it to take over all of us and how we treat others is a part of who we are, too. Our worship can't just be halfway or even most of the way. We can't just do good things some of the time or only love certain people. We have to worship God with all that we have and in all that we do. And even though we're not perfect, this is what we're aiming for the goal is one hundred percent.
- When I worship God, I can be sincere.

SCRIPTURE | Matthew 25:1-13

- Since we are talking about breaking news this month, there's one fact about breaking news we must remember: no one ever seems to know when that news is going to happen.
- Let's look at a short story in the Bible.
- INSTRUCTIONS: Read Matthew 25:1-13.
- Did you know that Jesus' return is a lot like breaking news? We don't know when it's going to happen! So, what does this have to do with our worship?
- You see, we don't want to be like the five women in the story who were not prepared for the bridegroom's return. When Jesus returns someday, we want to have decided to follow Jesus already. While we wait for Jesus' return, we should practice worship by living a life that honors God. We practice that in the way we live, the way we talk, the way we think . . . and when we choose to be sincere in all of those things.
- When I worship God, I can be sincere.

NOW WHAT? What does God want us to do about it?

REFLECTION | How Will You Worship God?

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Give each kid a sticky note and something to write with. Tell each kid to write on their sticky note and place it in the front of the room on a wall or a board.
- We've been talking about being sincere in worship. God wants our actions in our lives to match our worship.
- How will you be sincere when you worship this week?
 - Will you choose to be kind?
 - Will you help someone in need?
 - Maybe someone needs help with a chore.
 - Or maybe someone you know needs a kind word.
- Think of a way you can be sincere in your worship this week and put it on your sticky note. You can either write it out or draw a picture.

RESPONSE | "Every Move I Make"

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Play "Every Move I Make" by CJ and Friends and encourage the kids to sing and dance along.
 - * PRETEEN HACK: Put your preteens in the spotlight! Give them some time to learn the choreography and have them perform it for the rest of the group. Afterward, they could even teach it to everyone!
- This is a great song that reminds us that in everything we do, no matter what it is or where we
 are, we can worship God. Just like our Big Idea says, when I worship God, I can be sincere!

MEMORY VERSE | Memory Voices

• **INSTRUCTIONS:** As you tell the kids the memory verse, change your voice. You can be loud and then soft. Deep and then high-pitched. However you change your voice, tell the kids to repeat after you, mimicking the same voice.

PRAYER

God, thank you for the words you gave the prophet, Amos, and for showing us that our worship
must be sincere. Teach us how to let the things we do match the things we say, and help us
to remember that we can worship you in small and big ways from anywhere we are and with
everything we do. Amen.

SMALL GROUP TIME

DISCUSSION

- What can you tell me about Amos?

ACTIVITY | Whole Heart

- Another word for "sincere" is "wholehearted." So when we worship God, we need to do it with our
 whole heart. That means no shortcuts, and with everything we have in us.
- **INSTRUCTIONS:** Give the kids a printable with a heart puzzle and a piece of construction paper. Instruct them to cut the pieces of the heart out, and then glue it back together on the construction paper. Tell them to write "actions," "words," "thoughts," and "feelings" on each puzzle piece.
 - ★ PRETEEN HACK: Give your preteens some Health and Science News! Show this video on how the heart works. Ask: "Does anyone know your heart's main job? Now imagine if only half of your heart did its job. What would happen? What are some ways you can worship God with your whole heart your actions, words, thoughts, and feelings? Write them down on your heart puzzle."
 - **SPECIAL NEEDS HACK:** Pre-cut this printable with each piece already labeled. Have kids decorate each piece and put them together with a buddy.
- The pieces of the heart represent the things that make a "whole heart" our actions, words, thoughts, and feelings.
- Glue the pieces back together on the construction paper and write your name on the heart to remind yourself: when I worship God, I can be sincere.
